

Annual Report for Calendar Year 2023 -
Alexander and Margaret Stewart Trust

This past year marked the 75th anniversary of the founding of the Stewart Trust, established by the Stewart family to support cancer research and pediatric and cancer care for disadvantaged residents in the Nation's Capital. During the year, the Trust awarded funding to 46 outstanding non-profits. These grantee organizations and their projects can be found at: <https://www.stewart-trust.org/our-impact/> These awards included support for:

- D.C. Community health clinics - all Federally Qualified Health Centers (FQHCs) - focusing on primary care and other youth health services.
- Therapeutic intervention programs for children in D.C. early childhood education centers.
- Early cancer diagnosis programs for the Latina community (Nueva Vida).
- A long-term support program for children recovering from cancer (Special Love).
- Implementation of Unity Health Care's Cancer Peer Support Pilot Program focusing on underserved patients in Wards 7 and 8 in the District. This effort is administered by the Johns Hopkins Cancer Care Clinic at Sibley Hospital.
- Implementation of Children's National Medical Center's Mental health policy lab within its Child Health Advocacy Institute to advance public policies that improve pediatric mental health care across the District of Columbia; and Children's Innovations to Improve Autism Care Project to further work that comprehensively improves care for children with autism.
- An Infant Adoption Program with comprehensive services to pregnant women who are considering adoption. (Barker Foundation)
- A new class of Pew-Stewart Scholars for Cancer Research marking the 10th year of this Stewart collaboration with The Pew Charitable Trusts. In 2023, Pew and Stewart executed an agreement to extend this collaboration through at least 2031.
